The broadcast committee is asking for your help

Due to our current financial condition the Committee decided not to renew the contract for the Spanish Herald Broadcast. The committee is asking for your help. Not only by gifts and donations but by prayer also.

When I was praying about writing this letter and the work the committee is doing, my answer came by way of the book *Christian Science and Its Discoverer* by E. Mary Ramsey, p. 68-69:

"Christian Science teaches that God is the only cause. He is therefore the source of all supply; man is His image and reflection; he therefore reflects the abundance of God. Whence then comes poverty? It originates in the belief that matter, not Spirit, is the source of supply. On the other hand, a man who recognizes God as the source of supply is daily striving to manifest more of God's nature, to express more honesty, generosity, gratitude, wisdom and love, and these improved thoughts externalize themselves in what we call improved material conditions. The sense of lack disappears as one gains a clearer perception of his own nature, a deeper sense of his unity with God, and a wider sense of freedom and of dominion. Thus the disease called poverty can be healed by the "renewing of (the) mind." Moreover, the constant recognition of God as the source of supply which brings to the poor man better housing, better clothes, greater comfort, brings to the rich man freedom from the trammels of wealth. His tastes become simpler, his needs fewer, and he, too, becomes more conscious of the peace "which passed all understanding."

As long as we believe in matter as the source of supply we shall also believe that one man's gain is another man's loss, but when we perceive that Spirit is the source of supply, we see that man can have no need which Love cannot supply. In *Science and Health* (p. 206) Mary Baker Eddy wrote, *"In the scientific relation of God to man, we find that whatever blesses one blesses all, as Jesus showed with the loaves and fishes,-- Spirit, not matter, bring the source of supply."* This recognition of the infinity of abundance does more that help its possessor, it helps unconsciously to lift some of his neighbor's burden of fear, and helps to eliminate his sense of poverty.

If you have ever heard the Radio Sentinel Program on the radio you know what my answer to my prayer was saying. If you have not listened to the program, please do so and you will know what I am talking about. Please help the committee so we don't lose our ability to give in this way. *Jim Stumbaugh, WSBC Chair*

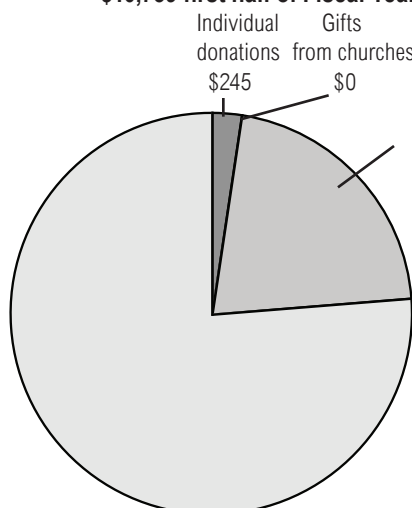

The Bible Lesson program airs on KKNW 1150AM at 3:30 in the afternoon Monday through Friday is simultaneously aired on streaming audio on newschannel1150.com. Use Windows Media Player. This makes the Bible Lesson available anywhere in the world.

Revenue- July through December, 2005

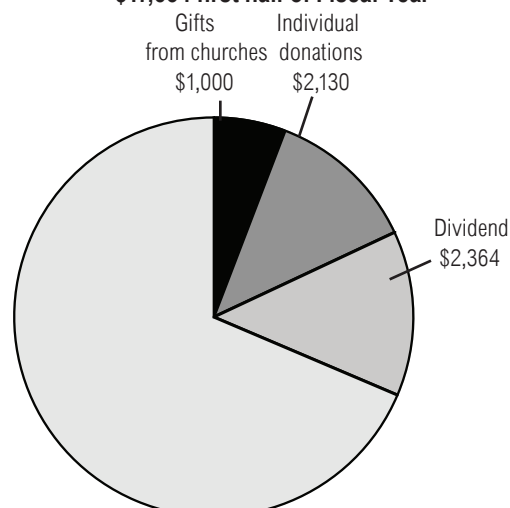
ACTUAL REVENUE

These charts show that the requested revenue was not evident during the past six months. Revenues were below budget by 39%.

On January 12, 2006 the WSBC Executive Board passed these two motions:

1. To cancel the Sunday 8:30 AM Spanish broadcast immediately.
2. To reduce the program days or stop altogether the Bible Lesson broadcasts on March 31, 2006, unless revenues increase to support the current five day per week programming.

We request societies and branches to increase their regular donations based upon donations received in the past Fiscal Year:

PAST DONATION	INCREASE BY
Between \$20 and \$49 per month	\$10 per month
Between \$49 and \$99 per month	\$20 per month
Between \$99 and \$140 per month	\$30 per month

For the rest of the Fiscal Year (February through June, 2006) we request past individual donors to donate monthly and that they encourage others, who consider our goal worthy, to donate monthly in order to keep these publications available to the radio listening public. The annual giving by individuals needs to increase by at least 100% over individual donations the last Fiscal Year.

Revised Budget January through June, 2006

\$21,269 less media and broadcast expense of Spanish Herald (\$179 per week x 24 weeks = \$21,269) minus \$4,296 = \$16,973.

How will your increased donations impact the broadcasting? If the societies and branch churches increase regular donations as indicated in the table, that would produce an extra \$2,600 by June 30. The 100% increase in annual individual donations, pro-rated monthly, would produce about \$888 in the next five months. That total (\$3,488) combined with the cancelation of the Spanish broadcast will reduce our next six month loss. The projected loss is \$2,070.

If we are on track toward this level of giving by March 31 we would not cut back the daily broadcast of the Bible Lesson, but would cheer you all on to continue the expansive love for your community. *John Olds, WSBC Treasurer*
